**Footnotes**

BOOTS broke alert pressuring the pace wresting a short lead on the turn, shook clear into upper stretch then held on while wearing a bit late. LEE'S LOOKER stalked the pace looming from mid track in upper stretch, gave steady surge reeling in BOOTS before running out of ground. BAND OF THIEVES slow early gave a mild rally into upper stretch, used even action in drive to best others. RILEY MY BOY slow early was swung seven wide in upper stretch passing tiring ones there. FRAZEE'S FOLLY hustled out would pressure then pursue under urging through the turn, wavered in upper stretch dropping off late. SIMPSON'S LUNCH hopped missing the break, was never involved finishing eight wide. WOLF EMPIRE slow early played no factor. TRAVELEZE showed early speed moving on pace into the turn, was angled to the rail near the quarter pole then gave way through the lane. MALIBU BEAU was always outrun. MAJOR STRIKE pressed the pace through the turn then wilted in upper stretch.
